

<p><b>What Should I Do to be a Good Digital Citizen - 1st &amp; 2nd Grade</b></p>	<p><b>Student initial</b></p>
<p><b>Good fit websites</b></p>	
<p>Ask permission before you go on the internet - on a phone, iPod, tablet or computer</p>	
<p>Choose websites that are just right for you.</p>	
<p>Show your adults your online activities.</p>	
<p>Ask your family members to help you. If it's not a good fit "x" out of it.</p>	
<p>Don't play any bad games. Play games that are just right for you.</p>	
<p>Set up game accounts WITH an adult.</p>	
<p>Always talk to an adult before you go on YouTube.</p>	
<p><b>Think about how you spend your time</b></p>	
<p>Don't spend too much time on the computer or internet.</p>	
<p>Finish your homework before using electronics.</p>	
<p><b>Don't share private information</b></p>	
<p>Keep your password private. Don't share it with friends, even your best friend. It's ok to share with family.</p>	
<p>Don't share your last name, address, phone number, birthday or other personal information on the Internet.</p>	
<p>Don't share your friends' personal information.</p>	
<p>Don't use your name for a password. Use numbers and letters in your password.</p>	
<p>Just use your first name, not your last name when setting up accounts with an adult.</p>	
<p><b>Talk to an adult if something makes you feel unsafe or uncomfortable</b></p>	
<p>If something pops up on the computer that makes you feel unsafe or uncomfortable tell a grown-up right away.</p>	

<b>Ask your parents before sharing pictures or videos</b>	
Don't post pictures of your friends without their permission.	
Don't post bad pictures.	
<b>Blogging</b>	
Show an adult before posting on a blog.	
Check your spelling, grammar and punctuation.	
<b>Take care of the family computer by:</b>	
Don't download things to your computer without your family's permission and help. It could be unsafe and have a virus. You could then spread it to other computers.	
If you get a pop-up, "x" it out. You could get tricked or you could get a computer virus. Tell an adult.	
Keep food and liquids away from the computer.	
Do not open emails from people you don't know.	
<b>Be kind on the Internet</b>	
Don't post anything mean or inappropriate. Everyone online can see it.	
Instead of writing a mean message online when you're angry with someone, take time to calm down.	
Only say something online that you can tell the person to their face.	
Don't hack someone else's computer. This also means pretending you are them if they are signed into an account.	
<b>What are Cyberbullies? Don't be one!</b>	
Cyberbullies write mean or scary messages or emails to people.	
Cyberbullies spread rumors or post photos of people without asking permission.	
Don't answer a cyberbully message. Instead, tell an adult or show the message to an adult.	
Ignore a cyberbully's message. Do not reply.	
Ask an adult to block a message from a cyberbully.	

<b>Don't talk to strangers online</b>	
Only talk to people you know online. Your family should know who you are talking to.	
Ignore messages from people you don't know. Ask an adult to block them.	
<b>What does digital citizenship mean?</b>	
"Digital" is all things having to do with the computer. A citizen is a person that belongs to a group. There are certain responsibilities you have as a digital citizen.
